Palm Beach County's Office of Inspector General Receives Its Second Re-Accreditation from the Commission for Florida Law Enforcement Accreditation, Inc.

On February 21, 2018, the Commission for Florida Law Enforcement Accreditation (CFA) reaccredited the Palm Beach County Office of Inspector General (OIG). During the November

2017 onsite assessment, the CFA assessors found the OIG to be 100% in compliance with the applicable standards set by CFA. The assessors' report noted that they were impressed by Inspector General Carey and all members of the OIG. The report concluded, "Inspector General Carev and other members of the OIG were accommodating verv confirmed through interviews and observation the OIG's polices are integrated into the way they do business."

An accreditation program has long been recognized as a means of maintaining the highest standards of professionalism. Accreditation is the certification by an independent reviewing authority that an entity has met specific requirements and prescribed standards. Law enforcement agencies and Inspectors General in Florida can attain accredited status through the CFA. Agencies remain accredited for a period of three years. After the three year period, they must be re-accredited.
